MEET SHARON KOTTS



As staff development and emergency preparedness coordinator, my role at North Star Manor is to train staff in a variety of areas. Each month at our all-staff meetings, we focus on some sort of emergency preparedness. Pictured in this newsletter is a view of our most recent staff meeting where we trained on smoke compartments, fire marshal recommendations, updates to our fire plan and paging for certain code situations. Aside from having monthly fire drills, we also are starting to have actual drills on things such as workplace violence, missing resident, code blue, etc. A sincere thank you to our staff for attending and participating in our monthly trainings and drills. In addition, we thank the State Fire Marshal and the leaders of the Warren Fire Department for recently spending the day with us and helping with our Emergency Plan.

VISITING NSM COMMUNITY

For two years, nursing home communities through the country have struggled with the ever changing guidelines regarding residents having visitors. As the vaccination rates within our country continue to grow, the strict guidance for visitation continues to lesson. North Star Manor would like to share some common questions and answers with you regarding the current visitation guidelines.

Can a visitor have close contact with a resident during a visit?

A: Visitors must wear a mask throughout the building and physical distance themselves from other residents when in common areas (hallways, dining rooms, etc.). In a private room with the resident, the visitor may choose not to wear a mask. North Star Manor does strongly recommend that all visitors wear a mask at all times throughout their visit. The resident has the right to choose to make close contact with any visitor.

Can a visitor share a meal with the resident?

A: Visitors may eat with a resident if the resident and visitor are within a private room. Sharing a meal with a resident in a common area is not allowed. If a visitor is wanting to sit in the dining room while the resident is eating, the visitor must be wearing a well-fitting mask and physically distance from other residents.

Should the facility pause communal activities and dining during an outbreak?

A: Any residents that are not up-to-date on the recommended COVID-19 vaccine doses that have had a close contact with someone with COVID-19 may be placed in quarantine. In general, residents who are up-to-date with all recommended COVID-19 vaccine doses do not need to quarantine.

What is the best way for residents or visitors to protect themselves from COVID?

A: The best and most effective way for a resident or visitor to protect themselves from COVID is by being up-to-date with all recommended COVID-19 vaccine doses. North Star Manor advises all residents, staff, and visitors to follow the recommended PPE guidelines within our facility. Besides vaccinations, it is valuable to wear a well-fitting mask, physical distance yourself from others, and continue to practice proper hand hygiene.

North Star Manor remains dedicated to the health and well-being of all our residents and staff and would ask that all visitors within our facility commit to that same goal.
